It has been eight years since the New Taipei City Cultural Bureau launched the "Student Fine Arts Competition." The bureau encourages students in New Taipei City to pick up their paintbrush and demonstrate their own creative identity and to enrich the culture of creativity through the competition. The event will further promote education in fine arts, and the preservation and conservation of cultural heritage. Most of all, it is an event that will explores the artistic potential of the New Taipei City young aspirants.

Entries for Nine Categories Now Open

The entry of "2019 New Taipei City Student Fine Arts Competition" will open from May 01 onwards. Amongst the nine entry categories, watercolor and print categories are open to elementary, junior and senior high school students. Chinese ink painting is open to junior and senior high school students only, and the drawing category to elementary students only. Students who are registered residents of, or currently attending schools in the New Taipei City, are eligible to enter. All participants should have Taiwanese citizenship. Works submitted should be produced within two years. One entry per category, and entry should be submitted with the participant's real name.

We encourage all New Taipei City young artists to seize the opportunity, submit your artworks, and show off your creative energy and youthful passion. Not only will you have the chance to bring home the prize and trophy, but also the opportunity to leap towards the center of the artistic world, and to paint your own unique future. The Future of Sci-Fi: Mitsuki Nakamura Retrospective Exhibition

Misuki Nakamura (1944-2011), who dedicated himself to the art of animation for more than four decades, was the soul of Japanese anime in the 1970s and 80s. A firstclass animator, Nakamura was the designated working partner of both Yoshiyuki Tomino and Hayao Miyazaki, and served as artistic director for almost one hundred animation films, such

as "Mobile Suit Gundam" and "Nausicaä of the Valley of the Wind." Following the retrospective exhibition in Denmark in 2017, this retrospective in Taiwan will present the original sketches and manuscripts of several of Nakamura's masterpiece, including "Mobile Suit Gundam," "Space Ace" and "Mahha GoGoGo."



Treasure of Golden Mountains Exhibition of **Shuijinjiou Geoheritage**

The epithermal deposits of Jinguashi. Jiufen and Wudan Mountain contain the richest mineral resources in Taiwan. In acknowledging these natural treasures, the Gold Museum organizes the program, aiming to bring the broad audience of Taiwan faceto-face to the history of Taiwanese gold and copper mining industry, and the island's rich natural resources. The show, apart from an overview of the geological structure of the Shuijinjiou area, also showcases the unique and precious mineral resources of the region. The program also includes topics of scientific studies and the relationship between goldmining and humanistic development, and how the correlation was the foundational "root" for the past development of this mountainous mining town.

In the Indigo World- Indigo Dye Exhibition of **Oian-Yi Wei**

Indigo dye is an important Hakka Lcultural tradition. The Sanxia Indigo Dyeing is said to be the dyeing destination for producing the most authentic textiles, enables the creation of a variety of products. This is achieved through the use of dves distilled from plants such as Assam, true indigo, Chinese indigo and dyer's method, the process such as harvesting, soaking, etc., and the application of resist-dyeing, shibori,

stitching and batik. This exhibition will feature works created through a wide range of methods, and is a tour de force of the application of dyeing techniques. In addition to her training in traditional dyeing techniques, the artist's integration of different cultures allows her to breathe an innovative new style into the tradition, hence creating a new kind of aesthetic that is completely her own. You will for sure be giddily lost in the unique world of indigo-inspired grace.



YEH, CHIA-YU tries to inject her personal life experiences into clay modeling, jute fibre weaving, wood structure, and moving image within installation, giving additional layers of depth by

their intrinsic features, such as textures, physical properties, etc. TSENG, YI-JIE uses acrylic as the main painting material, approaching "ARTS" itself during her creation and hence to develop her own multi series of works.
