The Legacy of Beauty— Retrospective Exhibition of Danfeng Liang

Having grown up in war-torn China, Professor Liang migrated to Taiwan in 1949 and became a lifelong resident of New Taipei City’s Yonghe District. In the later stage of her life, Liang donated all of her precious artworks and personal archives to the National Central Library, a total of 13,970 pieces of artworks and 5,700 manuscript items were collected.

This show at the New Taipei City Arts Center, which includes more than 100 pieces of artwork, features paintings and drawings are shown to the public for the first time. The exhibition, which have been carefully selected by Professor Liang’s family, display her artistic prowess in full force.

Into A Compound Scene

The exhibition commences with Frank Tang Kai-Yiu’s work. The artist employs drafting as the main painting technique in the Our Audible City series, guiding the audience through Hong Kong’s urban landscape. Kwong Kui-Choi’s The Disappeared Traveler begins with a 1983 tour guidebook, Hong Kong Tourist Yellow Pages. The artist erases the travelers’ face in the book and integrates the blurred imagery into his own imagination, recreating the landscape of contemporary Hong Kong.

Lin Ying-Chieh’s spatial installation Circle City owes its inspiration to her recent rumination on politics and monuments. Using water as a connective medium, Hsu Yen-Ting’s work Water Park can be deemed

a response to the common border between nature and humanity. In Stone Skipping and Floating Man, Liu Yu-Ting uses single-take to film his actors, who reaches a state of balance in water through consistent floating and sinking.

The artists investigate the political forces that form and present different spaces, architecture, visual imagery and media. They not only reexamine the ways that people, nature, urbanity and historical trajectory mingle, but also explore the ways people form connections with their environment and explore how individual voices should be used to question the surroundings when layers of history crush down on us.
